Offering something for history buffs and first time travellers alike, Scotland's numerous castles, lochs, and medieval cities are enough to please one's exploratory palate. In addition to its natural landscape, which has been an inspiration to artists and writers for centuries, and its rich, unique history which dates back to Roman times, Scotland is also home to the bizarre albeit delicious haggis, known for its Angus beef, and the source of over one-hundred whisky distilleries. If you wish to dip your toes into one of its many lochs, delve into a glass of pure malt whisky, or stroll through medieval castles, Scotland will welcome you with open arms.

Edinburgh is two cities in one: the medieval Old Town, its famous historical past and it the 'closes' and 'wynds' of the cobbled streets and the famous Royal Mile which leads from the castle to the park of Holyrood. Next to this, the newly completed multi million pound Parliament Building. There is also the elegant and classical New Town, its Georgian apartments, built for the Noble Classes who moved away from the old town to find space and light. Witness Neoclassical facades, wide open streets and leafy parks punctuated with elegant churches and museums of the 1700 to 1800's. The Medieval Old town has the Queen's residence, the Palace of Holyroodhouse, at its most eastern end, and is linked to the castle at its Western end by a mile of cobbled stones named 'The Royal Mile'.

#### Tuesday, June 6—Blair Castle and Dalwhinnie Whiskey Tasting

Today we make our way north to the magnificent Highlands. Our first stop is **Blair Castle** which has been in the Atholl family for more than seven centuries and is the ancestral home of the Clan Murray. Our next stop is **Dalwhinnie Distillery** for a whiskey tasting. Built in 1897 and currently the highest distillery in the country, Dalwhinnie – or "Plain of Meetings" in Gaelic – is named for its location at a junction of old drove roads, between two mountain ranges. Year after year it survives the coldest of conditions to produce smooth, golden heather honey-like spirit. Uncover the history behind the liquid.

From the castle, one can also gaze upon Bannock-burn, where the English were again defeated in 1314 by Robert the Bruce. In its day, Stirling Castle was not only a strategic, military post due to its geographic location in the Highlands and at the epicenter of the wars of independence during the 13th and 14th centuries, but also the home to such important Scottish monarchs like King James VI and Mary, Queen of Scots.

#### Joseph Best, D.D.S., Ph.D.

Dr. Best is a 1989 graduate of Marquette University School of Dentistry (MUSOD) and a adjunct associate professor at the dental school in the division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. He is the course director for the Medical Emergencies and Pharmacotherapeutics courses at MUSOD and lectures extensively in pharmacology, pain control, medicine, oral surgery and implant dentistry both at the dental school and in regional CE programs. Dr. Best received his Ph.D. in Pharmacology and a certificate in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from the University of Rochester School of Medicine and Dentistry. He is a board certified oral and maxillofacial surgeon and maintains a private practice with Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Associates of Waukesha in Waukesha, WI.



#### Joseph deGuzman, D.D.S., M.S.

After graduating from Dental School in 1989 Dr. deGuzman completed a General Practice Residency at the Clement Zablocki Veterans Administration Hospital followed by 6 years of private general dental practice. He returned to Marquette in 1995 for his residency in endodontics and received his Certificate in Endodontics and MS degree in 1997.
